Biography

Felicity Brown has designed for Alberta Ferretti, Loewe, Mulberry and most recently Lanvin in the few years since graduating from the Royal College of Art. She has a 1st class honours from the Glasgow School of Art, where she won the Royal Society of Arts Award and the Charles Rennie Mackintosh Award. On leaving the Royal College, Felicity's final show was selected to be exhibited at Sotheby's of London.

Felicity was encouraged to start her own collection with the support of her brother Henry and they launched for AW10 at London Fashion Week. Felicity is the Creative Director and Henry runs the business side.

For her debut Felicity created a small and impressive couture collection, inspired by Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec's paintings, where flamboyant and provocative women are painted wearing extravagant silk ruffles, showing off shamelessly. The dresses, made using precious silks, are highly structured with hand dip dyed pleats and prints.

The British Fashion Council were quick to recognise Felicity's talent and awarded her Newgen sponsorship for SS11.
